id you know that everyone who lives or owns property in Mott Park is a member of the Mott Park Neighborhood Association? Did you know that every member, regardless of whether they pay dues, is welcome at all of our functions and events?

So why should you pay dues to the association?

The MPNA functions on money from dues, gifts, donations and grants. A substantial portion of that comes from the dues paid by members.

- This newsletter is printed with money from dues as well as income from advertising.
- The annual rummage sale permit and advertising brings people from all over to visit our sales and to see what a great place Mott Park is.
- The MPNA has purchased tools for residents and students to use to clean up the park and will purchase more as needed.
- 6 MPNA meetings will be held this year to provide neighbors vital information on a variety of topics and to express their views on proposed actions by the Association.
- An annual picnic with music and food is a great way to meet new neighbors and to reacquaint yourself with old friends.
- At least one "Meet and Greet" and very fun community revitalization event will be sponsored by the Association.

Dues-paying members (we call them participating members) get these additional benefits:

- Participating members have the satisfaction of knowing that they are supporting a neighborhood association that works for their benefit.
- Only participating members have the privilege of voting in an election. They have a voice in who is running the association.
- Participating members are entitled to run a 30 word ad in the Service Guide to promote their local business.

Although only a small percentage of the households in Mott Park paid dues to the Association and almost 60% of that number paid more than the \$15 requested. Everyone who lives in the Park shares in the benefits of those things that the Association accomplishes. Please pay your Mott Park dues. Just use the envelope attached to this newsletter and mail it to me, or just put your check in an envelope and put it through the slot in my door at 910 Frank Street. Thanks so much for your participation.

Thymely Tips

pring is here I hope!! We made it through a really nasty winter! Hopefully our plants did too. Some of the more tender ones, like rhododendrons and azaleas might have bit the dust. If something didn't make it, maybe it's time to try a more hardy species like dwarf burning bushes, hydrangeas, sage, weigela, etc. Give me a call for more recommendations.

I'm trying a new thing this year, a "flower bomb". Mix 5 parts powdered clay, 2 parts compost, 1 part wildflower seeds, 1 part water and 1/4 part cayenne pepper. Shape into balls, dry and throw into tall grass and areas in need of wildflowers. I'm going to try it on the hill to teh south of the clubhouse.

I would like to take this opportunity to remind all Mott Park neighbors that we have a recycling program in our neighborhood. I'm a little ashamed that so few people seem to be recycling. It's so easy to get the blue bins. Just call Republic Services at 800-438-0966 and give them your name and address and they will deliver teh bin to your house. They take glass, metal, paper products, plastics, can. This is so much better than having it go in the dump! Every little thing helps our planet.

been upgraded. Our major message is:


- No action or agreements will be made that will adversely affect the surrounding neighborhoods.



- Print a map to be handed out in the park so that visitors can see the borders of Mott Park.






- Print the addresses of sales at homes on the back of the map so visitors know where the other sales are.
