Accomplishments

Last year's accomplishments included setting up a small water distribution location within Mott Park. We were able to accommodate neighbors who had a need for water

delivery and contacted us directly. In May we partnered with Kettering University for our annual spring clean up which was very successful and we hope to have them on board again this year. Last year was also our 3rd year as recipients of the Clean and Green grant and we were able to maintain over 30 properties within the Mott Park area and we have applied again this year. If awarded a grant this year we will be looking to maintain another 30 plus properties this year as well. Our yearly garage sell had a lot of participation and there were a lot of great deals out there. We hope to have even more participation this year. Another major accomplishment was the installation of new playground equipment while maintaining the rocket ship.

Mott Park Blight Squad: Update

With the change of season came a change in the blight squad. The blight squad was set to hibernate for the winter but member Bo Cummings came up with an idea to keep our group active through the winter fighting another problem. Snow! The blight squad has now morphed into a snow squad for the winter. With donations received from the community and MPNA we were able to purchase a new snowblower that will be used to clear the driveways and sidewalks for our elderly residents who cannot clear their own snow. We will do this after any major snow event.

2017 is shaping up to be another busy year for us. We estimate we are about half way through cleaning up blighted and abandoned property in the neighborhood. Here is a list of our plan for spring 2017!

- 1. Cover a rash of graffitied vacant businesses, and some vacant homes on Flushing Rd. and Chevrolet Ave.
- We have been selected by Kettering University to test some solar
 powered LED security lights and will install them on a vacant home.
 If the lights work well, Kettering will purchase more for us to install
 them on vacant homes. This will help to reduce squatter and other
 criminal activity.
- 3. With the aid of Kettering volunteers, board up several vacant homes in the neighborhood identified as squatter occupied.
- 4. House painting on an abandoned home on Dickinson St. that severely needs it and is a huge eye sore.
- 5. Target Joliet St. that has several blighted homes on one block.
- 6. Focus on more interior neighborhood blighted homes on completion of Joliet St.

In addition, we will partner with Kettering volunteers on our blight clean ups so we can clean up more than one house

at a time. We are also working with Kettering to get a stipend that can be paid to people that adopt our homes we have cleaned up. This will hopefully encourage more people


to volunteer to adopt homes and keep those on board that we already have.


