#### "Revitalization is alive and well in Mott Park!"



hen I walk around our lovely neighborhood, I am amazed at the beauty in the architecture and how rich we are in history. It is a shame that so many of the properties have fallen into such

states of disrepair, but the new things coming forth from this condition are encouraging and exciting! Over the course of the spring and summer, at least twelve people, including teenagers, have stepped up to the plate to tackle this mountainous task of improving our neighborhood. Some of these efforts have been coordinated and organized and some have been spontaneous, out of sense of duty or excitement of turning things around from negative to positive. Three teenagers did huge tasks over the whole summer, remaining faithful through to the end. Several volunteers jumped in on the projects after seeing the great results and desiring to be a part of positive change. Two of the volunteers became the kind of helpers that will jump in on request at any time, even in the final hour. New people stepped in, people that had never given much thought to community service. Neighbors started to realize the importance of maintaining their own properties. A grandparent even instructed a visiting grandchild of the importance of keeping things nice as we all picked up trash on Joliet! Frustrated neighbors were encouraged that things were on a better path and thanked the volunteers profusely. That was win/win for both--the neighbors were happy that adjoining properties were getting care and the volunteer beamed with pride and soldiered on! Later residents began to maintain adjoining properties after the worst of it was dealt with by the revitalization group. After earnest pleading, city blight coordinator Raul Garcia is giving Mott Park the attention it deserves, mostly because, in his words, "the residents of Mott Park truly care about and work hard for their community." That is so true and it obviously pays off! We were able to partner with the Land Bank, winning us a \$3,000 grant to clean and mow at least 25 properties; however, with frugal use of the funds, we maintained at least 40 properties! Others volunteered time and money to keep equipment running, and yet others hired professionals to maintain properties out of their own money. This has been an amazing time period for the residents of Mott Park--what a great bunch of people!

Following are some of the tasks accomplished either directly or indirectly by the revitalization group:

- Some absent homeowners started taking an interest in their properties again, due to the urging of concerned neighbors.
- Houses were spruced up for sale, sold, and bought by owners desiring to revitalize.
- Residents took an interest in fixing their own homes.
- Clean up on Perry and Joliet.
- Copious documentation of events at "problem" homes.
- Also performed was the clean up and mowing of up to 45, properties, some of which include 2316, 1908, 1911, 1912, 1917, 2301 Joliet; 915, 911, 821, 805, 809, 801, 1057, 1054, 1058, 1062 Chevrolet; 759, 755, 1007 Dupont; 2542, 2546, 2550, 2554, 2553, 2562 Tiffin; 2556, 2510, 2511 Bagley; 722 Frank; 1925, 1929, 1933, 1937, 1905, 1909, 1913, 1917 Flushing, plus some on Perry and Marquette, and some medians.

he Mott Park Golf Course
Association was formed
two years ago to manage
and operate the grounds and
facilities formally known at Mott

Park Golf Course. We have recently renewed our formal agreement with the City of Flint and now the Association has control over the club house and grounds. We are now working on plans for the future of the land and building.

After much study and hand wringing analysis, the Association has concluded that the restoration and operation of the area as the traditional golf course facility is not financially possible. We are very concerned, however, to allow the area to revert into a "wilderness area" as described in the City's master plan. We are, therefore, working on plans to develop the land as a diverse recreational public area.

There are many possible uses to be considered for the area, among them:

- Frisbee golf area
- Dog park
- Splash pad area
- Walking paths
- Picnic area
- Boat dock, canoe and kayak livery
- Golf driving range
- · Golf putting green

The Association is currently studying the feasibility and maintainability of these possible uses and the compatibility of these uses with the surrounding neighborhoods. Ultimately any plan for development has to be something acceptable to our neighbors and approved by the City of





Flint. If you would like a potential use considered as part of this study, the Association would love to hear from you. Please feel free to send your suggestions and your contact information to Ginny Braun at ginnybraun@bhhsmi.com

A cornerstone of any development plan is the restoration of the club house. We are exploring the manner and cost of ways to protect the building from vandalism as well as turning it into an area that people can rent for events such as meetings, weddings and other activities. This work has just begun and will be ongoing. We plan to keep the surrounding neighborhood associations apprised as we work on these things.


