

vacant properties, picked up trash from dumping in the road, got two vacant homes on the expedited demolition list, caused 6 abandoned cars to be removed from the neighborhood, turned one occupied home into Habitat for Humanity to help with structural repairs, and loaned tools to help neighbors of the vacant homes with their own repair/clean up projects. We also had success with having caretakers adopt all but two vacant properties to help with maintaining the yards after we completed a clean up.

Currently, we are working on two major clean up projects that involve painting an entire home and remodeling a vacant building front. In addition, we also had security lighting placed around a vacant building to ensure a safe area for school kids in the morning when it is dark. We are working on getting Safe Schools to ensure the electric bill gets paid to keep the lights on. We are currently looking at obtaining solar lighting for other locations to help prevent crime. We are receiving a donated decorative sign for the neighborhood from MBS Treasures of Lapeer. It is planned to be placed on a roadway flower garden. Our goal, until the snow starts to fly, is to focus on Joliet Street. Joliet is starting to become heavily blighted. We would like to see the area south and west of Chevrolet greatly reduced with blighted homes by next year. The blight squad has many more projects available and generally only works with two to five people on clean up days. So, we are in serious need of volunteers to help. The more helping hands we get the faster we can get our neighborhood cleaned up. We can also use people willing to keep up with yard work at homes that had completed clean up. 



ugust was a busy month for the Mott Park Recreation Area (MPRA). We had a flotilla of canoes, kayaks, rafts and tubes float down the Flint River from Tenacity Brewing to the recreation area. Over 200 people participated in the 3rd Annual Flotilla, sponsored by the Flint River Watershed Coalition. A couple weeks later, there was a bass fishing tournament on the river and a disc golf tournament in the recreation area. On the last weekend in August, both the 10K and the 8K Crim races passed the southeast portion of the recreation area. ow, this was a hot, dry summer!! Many of my plants didn't like it at all. Time to reconnoiter. Time to start choosing drought resistant plants.

My favorite perennials for sunny spots are purple coneflowers, black eyed susans, sedums, coreopsis, yarrow, daisies; for shade hostas, hostas, and hostas. There are so many colors (from dark green to almost yellow) and sizes. Yuccas are really drought resistant too. By the way using drought resistant plants in your landscaping is called xeriscaping.

I definitely had problems with annuals. They pretty much bit the dust for me. They needed steady watering and I just got too busy to keep up a proper schedule. My best results were with geraniums. They really only needed watering every other day unless they were in pots and then I watered just about every day.

My poor rhododendrons and azaleas were really unhappy. I had to water them the most and they still look sad and lost some branches. A couple of them just died. I noticed that the big white old fashioned white hydrangeas looked pretty good this year. Also rose of sharons fared very well in this heat, as well as burning bushes, and my weigelias. Because of the drought conditions not many people had success in creating lush lovely gardens, a few looked lovely but the rest of us didn't fare too well and the garden contest fizzled, but the MPNA spent money on supporting the Blight Squads' wonderful work!!!

Steve Major is the HERO of Mott Park this year!! It amazes me how Mott Park neighbors just see something that needs to be done and " just do it". Thanks to his crew also. If you would like to help him (and he could use the help), his number is 248-953-9498. Again THANK YOU to the Mott Park neighbors who tended the gardens during this very hot, dry summer. They are (in no particular order) Denny Donlan, Dale Radford, Marta Tavakoli, the Eddy family, Pat Seals, the Barkeys, the Donnegans, Annette Maynor, the Whtingers, Judy Alexander, Angela Schwartz and Judy Trombly (who took over the site at Nolen Dr. and Marquette St. from Mr. Owensby, who sadly for us is moving).

Again the Kettering students have been a real asset in our efforts to keep Mott Park beautiful. They've weeded, trimmed, swept, etc. We're beginning our efforts to make a more accessible safe and attractive walking trail along the river, starting at Nolen Dr. and University Ave. We'll be trimming back the brush and limbing up trees.

Again, don't forget that fall is the time to plant bulbs for spring blooms. It's also a great time to plant trees, bushes and perennials - many of which will be on sale.

It has phone numbers for leaving anonymous tips, the dumping hotline, street maintenance, poison control and more. This same page has a FAQ section for the MPNA. On our "Dues and Donations" page you can order a Mott Park Chronicle, give dues online, or get our PO Box information if you need to mail something to the MPNA. On the site there is a photo gallery to view fun photos of past events in the neighborhood. Also under "Resources" we have a "Neighborhood News" link and a "Report Suspicious Activity" link. The neighborhood news link contains a post about the Flush for Flint initiative, the CPTED Assessment application, Kettering employee home purchase initiative, Metro Housing Counseling Programs and more. The "Report Suspicious Activity" link can be used to do just that. If you see suspicious/nuisance activity going on in the neighborhood that may not warrant a 911 call, you can report it using this tool. This information will be shared with University Avenue Corridor Coalition and with our assigned local law enforcement. Note: UM-Flint Police officer Lt. Phil Smith is working in this area on drug related crime. UM-Flint officers can make arrests and have done a tremendous job in the University Avenue Corridor. The **Vice-President** shall assume the general duties and responsibilities of the President in his/her absence from a particular meeting. In the event that the office of President is vacated as a result of death, resignation, removal, or any other reason, the Vice-President shall assume the office of President.

The Treasurer shall collect and receive MPNA membership dues, establish and preserve MPNA financial records, provide an accounting of the receipts and expenditures of MPNA funds at general meetings and perform such other duties as the MPNA shall prescribe. The Treasurer shall preside at MPNA meetings in the absence of both the President and Vice-President. The Treasurer shall assume the office of the President in the event that both the President and Vice-President shall be unable to serve for any reason. The Treasurer shall be authorized to pay such expenses as approved by the MPNA.

The **Secretary** shall record and maintain the minutes of the MPNA, preserve copies of all materials coming before the MPNA, and perform such other duties as are customary or may be assigned by the MPNA.
