Last year we received Park Tender status which gave us access to more money that went towards work in the playground. Last year a few broken pieces were removed and two new items were installed. Take These Steps to Flush Pipes and Aid in Flint Water System Recovery

epa.gov/flint

Flushing pipes is very important to remove loose lead particles and to coat pipes. Lead line replacement is the long-term goal.

The state will cover this cost.

Residents will receive a credit on their water bill.

Step 1

Run cold water at the highest flow in the bathtub* for 5 minutes.



No showerhead Flow too low





*If you do not have a bathtub, run cold water at highest flow from a laundry tub or garden hose.

Step 2

Run cold water at the highest flow from the kitchen faucet for 5 minutes.



Flip lever to bypass filter or remove filter firstthen reinstall.





Step 3

Do this every day for 14 days in May.





Watch the water draining to avoid overflow of sinks or tubs.

EPA continues to recommend Flint residents drink filtered water. Sensitive populations (pregnant women, breastfeeding women & children under 6) should continue to use bottled water until further notice.



Tenew The Avenue

An update by Tom Wyatt of Kettering University

am happy to report the following strategies and activities within Mott Park and the rest of the University Avenue Corridor.

- A feasibility study of a domestic violence initiative was conducted this month. Findings will be presented to the Renew The Avenue Steering Committee.
- Kettering student work-study employees are gathering data this month about supportive services for drug / substance abuse, domestic violence, and dispute resolution.
- A second Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design (CPTED) assessment was conducted at Sunset Village Apts. A plan will be presented to the owners this month.
 Implementation will begin this Spring.
- Sunset Village Apts. will also be participating in a Placemaking Assessment (in addition to the CPTED / Safety assessment) to make the area more attractive and usable by families, children. Enhancements may include: playground, gardens, and other features.
- Starting this month, the University of Michigan

 Ann Arbor will be coming through the area
 doing assessments of properties as well as focus
 groups and surveys about perceptions, quality of
 life, and other matters.
- The Flint Urban Safety Corps will begin work in late Spring/early Summer to start a tenant association at Sunset Village Apts.
- The CPTED Assessment application is now available digitally at: http://goo.gl/forms/ NsKUCgylxF A mini grant of up to \$250 towards safety improvements is available on a first come first served basis.

- Flint Urban Safety Corps, Mott Park residents, and Kettering staff will be conducting those assessments through September 2017.
- CORE Security, a partnership of Federal, State, County, City law enforcement and private security in the Corridor are morphing into CORE Community CompStat (CCS) on June 14th. This group will meet monthly to look at crime trends and social network analysis (individuals repeatedly connected to crimes in the area).
- CCS will steer the efforts on drug market enforcement, property crimes, and other incidents.
- Two part-time officers from Flint PD have been hired and will begin working in the corridor in late May / early June through September 2017.
 They will be restricted to this geographic area.
- There is an interest in conducting a Placemaking Assessment at Mott Park (the actual park) this summer. More information on that at the June 6th MPNA meeting.
- The Flint Urban Safety Corps are working to start business associations at Flushing / Fifth, Court/ Beecher, and Grand Traverse/University. Clean ups, enhancements, and other types of support will be outcomes of this strategy.
- All homes that participate in the Habitat for Humanity Home Repair Program will be eligible for a CPTED assessment.
- We are in the middle of a Placemaking Assessment at Durant Tuuri Mott to transform the outdoor spaces into active and attractive spaces for the community. A final site-plan will be available for viewing in September.

- A new neighborhood group has formed called the Stevenson Block Club. Their neighborhood boundaries are: Flushing / Fifth to the Flint River / Grand Traverse to Chevrolet.
- The 50/25/25 Sidewalk Replacement Program will soon be starting. We have been told by the City that work begins July 1. An application will be available online very soon.
- We will be replacing a few street lights with LED lights in late spring / early Summer. These lights are more efficient and aid in providing safer places.
- We are purchasing a mobile license plate reader with facial recognition technology in June. This will be installed on a UM-Flint DPS patrol car. The reader can identify thefts, warrants, known associates, etc. Facial recognition can be used when a individual does not have proof of ID.



We always need newsletter carriers to deliver newsletters 2 times a year. Also needed are phone callers who are willing to make phone calls to people in Mott Park about

4 - 6 times a year. They will get a list of approximately 25 people and can leave a message on the answering machine if no one is home. Contact Chris Monk for more details!

We have some great neighbors! Thank you to the Barkeys, Ginny Braun, Edith Campbell, Bill Heatley and Karla Froehlich for taking care of the trash cans around the park! They empty the trash cans and help keep our park clean. If you see them down in our park thank them, it is an amazing job they do and I am grateful that they volunteer every year.
