

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

## Won't you be my neighbor?

My three year old son and two year old daughter have had so much fun outside this summer! But on rainy days (or really hot ones) we spend time inside, and sometimes watch TV. One of my kids' favorite shows is Daniel Tiger's Neighborhood. If you watched the program, you might recognize many of the characters from the longtime beloved show Mr. Rogers' Neighborhood. We love the program, not just because it's music is catchy (or that the kids watch it long enough for us to catch up on the dishes) but also because it talks a lot about being friendly towards your neighbor. Many of you may have grown up with Mr. Rogers Neighborhood or raised children who watched it. Who can forget his iconic song each episode in which Mr. Rogers would always warmly ask, "won't you be my neighbor?"

Mott Park is a neighborhood with a rich history and many longtime residents who remain a pillar in the community. At the same time, it's also rapidly changing. One year after moving in wife and I are

already meeting new homeowners, new neighbors who are renting, as well as longtime residents. We've found so much value in getting to know our neighbors. I think there are a few reasons for that.

The first reason is that our neighbors are awesome! They range from young couples building their lives together just like my wife and I, hard working men and women raising their families, and retired folks living their golden years in our beautiful neighborhood. They are part of what makes Mott Park such a great place to live. What kinds of rich stories are waiting to be told by the people who live right next door? Another reason for getting to know them is for security reasons. One of the most effective ways you can deter crime in your neighborhood is knowing your neighbors and forming a network that keeps one another informed.

When we had a crime take place at the end of our street, I was able to quickly call my neighbors and find out critical information, even though I wasn't home. We were able to quickly assemble a 911 call-in campaign to make sure the limited resources of the city reached our street, and it worked! A police officer was eventually dispatched.

When getting to know your neighbors, I always suggest the "9 square method". Sometimes it helps to draw it on a piece of paper. Draw three rows of squares for a total of nine. Your house is the middle square. The squares on the left and right are the houses to the left and right of you. The other squares are the three houses across the street from you and the three houses behind you. Make it a point to know each of these neighbors. If you don't know them, it's never too late to introduce yourself.

My hope is that we can all take the time to get to know one another, welcome renters as a valued and diverse part of our community, and create a more safe and happy Mott Park for generations to come.

In 2010 the club started a course development fund to improve existing courses and explore the installation of new courses. In 2017 the club donated \$5,000.00 to the Mott Park Recreation Association for the Mott Park Disc Golf Course which was matched by Kettering and The Community Foundation of Greater Flint. This made the Mott Park Disc golf course a reality and it was installed in September of 2017.

To promote disc golf in the area the club has sponsored a kids day and learn to play disc golf event. Through these events we have gotten free discs into the hands of 100 plus non-disc golfers. We gave clinics, demos, and offered instruction during these events The Flyerz host a yearly fundraiser event called The Frozen Flyerz. The club has raise nearly \$10,000 to the following causes: The Food Bank of Eastern Michigan, The YWCA, and *Flintkids.org*.
